



Managing Canine Patients with Behavioral Changes Related to Brain Aging

Explore with the owner whether one or more of the following age-related behavioral changes is present in a senior canine patient (please scroll down for additional information):

Confusion

Decreased Social Interaction

Sleep or Activity Changes

House-Soiling Accidents



Changes are identified

Rule out other conditions that may be responsible for the behavioral change. Meanwhile begin feeding **Prescription Diet® b/d® Canine pet food**
